PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE -

Dear Parents, Staff and Students

The school has a strong reputation for providing a quality learning environment, a caring welfare structure, fantastic facilities and great achievements. This is further enhanced by the school providing the best education including a focus on academic achievement and excellence. It is not about lessening any focus on the performing arts, sport or a broad curriculum, but rather enhancing what we have to truly cater for the needs of all students.

The core of our business in school is teaching and learning, to provide the environment for the best learning outcomes for all students. We need to foster the value of education and learning, and the importance of students giving of their best. We need to prepare students not only for success in examinations, but also for their path after school, whether that be university, TAFE, other studies or work.

School Contributions for Years 7 - 12

Parents have received their school fees information that relates to their child/children. This indicated the payments that are applicable to all students, as well as the costs involved in studying elective subjects in Years 9-12. These fees are now due.

We really appreciate that Mackellar parents pay these fees promptly. It allows us to purchase teaching and learning resources for use for the whole year. Parents, please realise that the only thing we do with your financial contribution to your child's learning is spend it on their learning. The General Contribution covers expenses such as the student diary, printing, general school supplies, textbooks on loan, educational materials and equipment.

Year 12 and the HSC

As we are in the final five months of schooling leading to the HSC Trial Examinations it is extremely important that our Year 12 students develop a focused study plan so they can achieve the best possible results in the HSC. Doing your best and being successful in the HSC provides more options for your future. I ask parents to assist their daughters to allocate their time wisely over the ensuing months so that sufficient time is given to study for these important examinations. Each student should be averaging 3 – 4 hours per day and at least 6 – 7 hours on the weekend.

Open Day 14 February and Open Evening 15 February

Our Open Day for Years 5 and 6 and their parents and the Parent Information Evening were held recently. Primary students discovered more about the excellence of their local girls' high school and participated in school activities and parents discovered the high quality education that we provide at Mackellar.

Applications for Mackellar's 2023 Gifted & Talented programs were due by 17 February; Expression of Interest Forms where you will nominate the high school you would like your daughter to attend for Year 7 2024 have been issued by public primary schools this week and are due to be returned to them by 17 March 2023.

Local Catchment Area for Mackellar Girls

The Department of Education has determined that all government schools need to have a local catchment area. This has not previously applied to single sex schools. Mackellar Girls now has a local area, with all girls living within that area entitled to attend Mackellar Girls.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN has always been tested in May, but from this year, it has been moved to March. NAPLAN will be sat March 15-24 for Years 7 and 9.

Sanitary products for all students

The NSW Government now provides free tampons and sanitary pads to all female students. There are dispensers in all the girl's toilet blocks, which students may use when they require sanitary products.

Cyberbullying

The eSafety Commissioner reported an 80% increase in reports of cyberbullying in the first half of 2022, compared to the same period in 2021. There has been a sustained increase in online socialising, and with it comes online bullying. The spike in online bullying worries experts because it is more relentless than face-to-face bullying, harder to block out and becomes magnified and concentrated. This type of bullying has led to teenage suicides.

Parents should be aware of what their children are doing on social media, particularly Tiktok, Snapchat and Instagram. Programs that look fun and educational can be more sinister than they appear. Fortnite, Roblox and Minecraft can be a breeding ground for anti-social and bullying behaviour. Roblox can display graphic, inappropriate material for teenagers. 74% of Australian parents don't know what their children are doing online and 41% have never checked their child's online activities.

There are warning signs to look out for if you suspect your child is being cyberbullied. They may hide their devices, be secretive about who they are talking to, they may be worried, anxious or scared, have unexplained aches and not want to go to school.

Bully Zero recommends to tackle cyberbullying:

- Before giving your child a device or smartphone, go over the ground rules of use.
- Reassure your child you will support them.
- If your child is experiencing cyberbullying, ensure they feel they are being heard.
- Collect evidence by taking screen shots and printing out messages.
- Remove bullying messages from your child's device so they don't re-read them.
- Help your child to block or unfriend the person sending those messages.
- Advise your child not to respond to any bullying messages.
- Report the abuse to the social media site. If there are threats to hurt or harm, contact the police.

Student Merit Award System

At Mackellar we have an extensive award system designed to acknowledge achievement and encourage effort and improvement. Every student is encouraged to give of their best, and every student is eligible for these awards.

Personal Best Assemblies

Each semester students who are achieving their personal best, as indicated by their School Report, are acknowledged. In Years 7-10, a Gold Merit Award indicates personal best in all subjects on their semester report; a Silver Merit Award indicates personal best in all but one or two subjects. In Years 11-12, a Gold Merit represents 5 subjects of personal best and a Silver Merit all but one subject.

Mackellar Merit Certificates

Merit Certificates are issued by teachers for academic excellence, sport, school service, leadership and extra curricular programs. Points from 1 - 5 are assigned to each certificate, depending on the excellence of the achievement.

Merit Certificates are issued for successes such as outstanding assessment tasks or tests, commitment to homework, excellent organisation, representing the school individually or in a team, school service, consistent punctuality, fundraising, band, debating and community service.

Merit Certificates are tallied by the Assistant Year Adviser and may result in the award of Merit Banners, Medallions and Plaques that are awarded at the end of the year on Presentation Day.

Upon receiving 3 or more Merit Banners, a student receives a Merit Medallion; upon receiving 6 Merit Banners a student receives a Merit Plaque.

Research shows that the best way to support your daughter to learn a language is to **be positive about language learning!** Talk about the benefits, share your experiences of times when you wish you could have spoken another language, tell them about the people you've met who spoke other languages and how much your life was enriched by these meetings.

Our Year 10 History Elective students have been making great use of our database resources. They have been learning how to critically select information for their historical investigations, and we have been impressed with their dedication to the task. We hope that the skills they are learning in the library will be useful to them, not only in their current studies but in their future academic pursuits as well.

On February 14 we celebrated **Library Lover's Day** and hosted a Blind Date with a book event. Students could choose a wrapped book without knowing what it was, and take it on a "blind date". NAPLAN

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy Information for parents and carers

- All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in March each year.
- NAPLAN tests students' skills in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Students read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test.
- Students do four different tests. The names of the four tests are:



- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test questions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- Schools will get their students' results. The school will then give parents/carers a report showing their own child's results.
- Parents/carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- NAPLAN shows how students are going all over Australia. People who work in the Australian Government, state and territory education authorities and schools use NAPLAN results. The results let them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about your child doing the tests.
